WHY?

- . It fits with our mission and members' passions and strengths, and the St. Charles Center's mission.
- . It shifts our focus from "we have to grow or else we die" to "look at the good we can do together."
 - . We involve all ages—children, youth, adults. It amplifies things we already are doing.
 - . New Orleans has more human needs than just about any other city.

It is a positive for everyone, even those who don't want to get involved personally.

How?

- . Organize at least one church-wide "helping others" project each month. Invite non-members and prospects to join us. Growing, aim for more.
 - . Choose projects broad-based in appeal that fit in with our mission.
- . Publicize community actions into all our messaging, worship, outreach activities.
- . Projects must be meaningful, action-oriented, group-oriented, with a clear goal.
 - . Develop specific volunteer projects for children, youth and people who need more sedentary projects.
 - . This doesn't require changing anything we do now. It doesn't replace work of the Community Engagement team but it can build on it.
- . Grow to possibly form partnerships with other select groups—non-profits, churches, community organizations, particularly across racial and demographic lines.
- . This focus on service fits in with other actions we decide should be in our growth plan.
 - To boost the idea's success, the Leadership Team seeks your approval and commitment. If you do agree, we will ask a core group to commit to involvement and recruiting others. We hope you'll say yes and look to fresh, innovative ways to grow St. Charles.
